

Checklist for Accessible Voting



This is my plan for voting:

- I plan to vote in person on election day.
- I plan to vote in person at my advance poll (early voting).
- I plan to vote before election day by mail. (Apply early to get your voting kit.)



ID for voting in person:

- I'm bringing my government-issued ID with my photo, name and address (e.g. driver's licence).
- I'm bringing two different types of ID with my name and address. (Visit elections.ca for the list of accepted ID.)
- I don't have ID and need to bring someone along to vouch for me.



What do I need to make my voting experience successful?

When I go behind the voting screen (if voting in person), I want to have:

- A large-grip pencil
- A magnifier
- Support from Elections Canada staff
- My own support person
- The list of candidates in large print
- A tactile and braille voting template (only on election day)



I will call at least one week before election day to ask for (1-800-463-6868 or 1-800-361-8935 [TTY]):

- An application for a vote-by-mail kit
- Sign language interpretation at the polls
- Other accessibility services at my polling place



Is there anything else that I need?
